This workshop, which is open to NH teachers only, will address *Theme E: Cultural Development, Interaction and Change* of the New Hampshire Curriculum Framework. In particular, topics in geography, world history, anthropology, sociology and psychology will be discussed. The workshop will include lectures by East Asia specialists and curriculum implementation discussions.

Participants will receive \$130 worth of curriculum materials, including a subscription to *Education About Asia*. Upon completion of the workshop participants will receive a **\$100 stipend** and **certificate of completion**.
